Florida Statutes provides a limited list (below) of property owners who may qualify to have their name and deed references be protected in our records. The categories listed below are abbreviated for space; for complete details of qualifications, please refer to Section119.071, Florida Statutes.

• A person who has been the victim of sexual battery, aggravated child abuse, aggravated stalking, harassment, aggravated battery, or domestic violence, with official verification that an applicable crime has occurred (5-year renewable exemption from date of request).

#### **Current and Former:**

• All law enforcement personnel, including correctional and correctional probation officers.

• Personnel of the Department of Children and Families whose duties include the investigation of abuse, neglect, exploitation, fraud, theft, or other criminal activities.

• Personnel and domestic violence advocates of domestic violence centers certified by the Department of Children and Families.

• Personnel of the Department of Health whose duties are to support the investigation of child abuse or neglect.

• Personnel of the Department of Health whose duties relate to social security benefit determinations, investigations of complaints against or inspection of healthcare facilities or healthcare practitioners.
